Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education. Title I is part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) signed into law in 1965 by President Lyndon Johnson. In December 2001, President Bush signed into law the "No Child Left Behind Act."
